*Sunset stroll by the Canal Saint-Martin*



Nowadays, this ever-gentrifying 19<sup>th</sup> century waterway, Canal Saint-Martin or simply the Canal, and its immediate surrounding area, are one of the most sought-after quarters of Paris and over the past 10 years it has become the trendiest place to live, shop, eat, drink and have fun. At night, the Canal draws a crowd to its shabby-chic style bars and hip bistros. The Canal Saint-Martin is well worth a few hours of your time - both on foot or on an excursion boat (different option). Be sure not to miss watching bridges rise and turn to allow barges to pass nor the best spots for viewing great graffiti and street art. Note that lining the canal or across, you will find a lot of local bobo

*A unique journey through the shopping arcades*



This delightful walk explores a part of Paris hardly known by travelers, the Paris arcades. They were designed by town planners from the late



18<sup>th</sup> - beginning of the 19<sup>th</sup> century to give pedestrians protection from mud and horse drawn carriages. In the architectural aspect it was important because this new structure with glazed roof functioned as a covered, enchanting street. They were the new typology of the public space. Today, some of these arcades have been fully refurbished to their past glory and the sumptuous displayed merchandise joins the past to the present.

## *Must-see new cultural places in Paris!*

The City of Light offers a dazzling new cultural scene. Several venues have now cropped up on the Paris scene, offering yet more memorable options in terms of leisure and culture.

Check out the newly refurbished **Hôtel de la Marine** and the **Bourse de Commerce** – Pinault collection

The fashion Museum, **Palais Galliera** unveiling its new Gabrielle Channel galleries;

**Etoile Voltaire**, a cultural center hosting 5 movie theaters, the *Maison du cinéma* and the *Société des réalisateurs Français*.

The collections are presented in an entirely renovated and enlarged space at the **Musée de l'Orangerie** –

The **Musée Carnavalet** – *Musée historique de la Ville de Paris*, has reopened to the public after a large- scale renovation program.

The **Archaeological crypt of the Ile de la Cité**, closed after the fire in the cathedral, has reopened with a new exhibition, with models and 3D videos.

**La Samaritaine**, “ Temple of the art of living” a department store closed since 2005, has reopened after massive renovation and refurbishment work.

The **Temporary Grand Palais** on the esplanade of the Champs de Mars will be hosting fashion shows, exhibitions, events, Saut Hermes, Fiac, and Olympic games in 2024.

**Musée des Égouts**, closed in 2018 for work, has reopened to reveal the inner workings of Paris sewer system.

The **Maison Poincaré** – *maison des mathématiques*, in the former laboratory of Jean Perrin in the campus of *La Sorbonne*.

The **Maison de Victor Hugo**, has reopened after refurbishment and now offers a new layout.

The **Reserves Romainville**, a new conservation and exhibition space (FRAC) *fond regional d'art contemporain*.
